SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Infant/Child Baptism: Baptism is our incorporation into the Body of Christ and the foundation of our sacramental life. Contact Ana Valencia at the parish center to begin the process of instruction and celebration.

Children's Penance/Eucharist/Confirmation: Preparation for these sacraments of initiation are handled within our Faith Formation program. For questions, contact Ana Valencia.

Adult Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the path for those seeking to learn more and perhaps ask for full initiation into the Catholic church. A related process is available for those adults who only need to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. For initial questions, contact any clergy person of the parish.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Penance: this Sacrament is celebrated Saturday from 4:00-4:30 PM in the Church. Other times are available by making an appointment with parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick: freely offered to those who are sick, facing surgery, those with chronic mental or emotional illness, and those of advanced age. In the Covid-19 era, there are certain conditions that prevent clergy from home visits and hospitals, but contact Fr. Blicharski at the parish if you would like the sacrament and we can determine if we can celebrate it safely.

SACRAMENTS OF SERVICE

Christian Marriage: Congratulations and blessings on your engagement. Every couple has unique gifts and needs, and our clergy will walk and work with you to meet our own time-tested standards to get you to the altar and beyond. Contact anyone on the pastoral team.

Holy Orders: If you are sensing God's call to service as a priest or deacon in the church, contact our pastor and/or any parish team member you feel can best serve you.

Similarly, even though there are no sacraments associated with the religious life, monastic life, lay ministry or faith-based humanitarian service, please contact us if we can help you in your discernment.

Due to COVID-19 realities, all non-parish-wide activities (i.e., groups) are suspended for the foreseeable future.

COVID-19 FURTHER CHURCH RESTRICTIONS

As the latest wave of the virus takes hold in New Jersey and cases climb dramatically, we are reducing church capacity to 104 (from 150), keeping windows open and overhead fans going to enhance the movement of air. We are adding a 6:00 PM Sunday Spanish evening Mass to provide an added safe option for worship and to increase weekend capacity. Those in vulnerable groups should stay home, and those who are sick or symptomatic must stay home. Catholics in our diocese will continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass until further notice.

PARISH OFFICE CLOSED UNTIL SEPTEMBER 2021

As near-misses and second-level exposures to the coronavirus increase among parish staff and leaders, **the parish center is again closed to the public.** The parish team will use this time to reconfigure the entrance area to have a safer degree of encounter with parishioners when we do open again. Staff is continuing to work remotely and in the office and can be reached by phone or email.

COMMUNITY NEWS

POPE FRANCIS' FEBRUARY 2021 PRAYER INTENTION

Violence Against Women: We pray for women who are victims of violence, that they may be protected by society and have their sufferings considered and heeded.

FEBRUARY IS BLACK HISTORY MONTH

An annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing their central role in U.S. history. Also known as African American History Month, the event grew out of "Negro History Week," the brainchild of noted historian Carter G. Woodson and other prominent African Americans. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. (*from history.com*)

SAINT VALENTINE

Saint Valentine, officially known as Saint Valentine of Rome, is a third-century Roman saint widely celebrated on February 14 and commonly associated with "courtly love."



One common story about St. Valentine is that in one point of his life, as the former Bishop of Terni, Narnia and Amelia, he was on house arrest with Judge Asterius. While discussing religion and faith with the Judge, Valentine pledged the validity of Jesus. The judge immediately put Valentine and his faith to the test. St. Valentine was presented with the judge's blind daughter and told to restore her sight. If he succeeded, the judge vowed to do anything for Valentine. Placing his

hands onto her eyes, Valentine restored the child's vision. Judge Asterius was humbled, became baptized, then freed all of his Christian inmates.

St. Valentine was later arrested again for continuing to try to convert people to Christianity. The story tells that St. Valentine was imprisoned for marrying Christian couples and aiding Christians being persecuted by Claudius in Rome. When Valentine attempted to convince Claudius of Christianity, Claudius became enraged and sentenced Valentine to death, commanding him to renounce his faith or be beaten with clubs and beheaded. St. Valentine refused to renounce his faith and Christianity and was executed outside the Flaminian Gate on February 14, 269.



YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH: UPDATES

At the parish, our Year of St. Joseph will run until a closing festival on May 1, 2022. Each month will have an associated Contemplative Theme and Action Theme.

For February 2022:

The contemplative theme is **Hiddenness (Matthew 6:6)**.

Jesus' Gospel teaching that is proclaimed on Ash Wednesday advises us to "go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret." As we prepare to enter a second Lent in a row in some form of pandemic lockdown, how can we learn from opportunities gained and squandered last year during the first lockdown? Where is that inner room? What are we doing there?

"During the hidden years in Nazareth, Jesus learned at the school of Joseph to do the will of the Father." (Pope Francis, *Patris Corde*, December 2020.) How are we learning to do the will of the Father?

The pastor will address Contemplative Hiddenness in his next **Chapter Talk, Tuesday, February 16, following the 7:00 PM Mass.**

Our parish Year of St. Joseph action theme for February is **Almsgiving and Fasting**. Now is the time to reflect on concrete Lenten actions in the area of almsgiving and fasting. Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl campaign is our one parish-wide almsgiving project, but need not be limited to that. There are also many aspects of fasting beyond the few dietary restrictions the church recommends during Lent.

Our Mass times for Ash Wednesday are: 8:30 AM, 12 noon and 7:00 PM. We will have the pastoral flexibility to provide bilingual Masses for all three times, if need be.

DIRECTIVAS PARA EL MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA



En las directivas tanto del Vaticano como de la diócesis, las cenizas se van a esparcir silenciosamente sobre las cabezas de los creyentes este año en nuestras tres misas parroquiales, **8:30 AM, 12:00 mediodía, 7:00 PM**. Esta es una práctica antigua todavía utilizada en partes del mundo católico y es más segura en estos tiempos durante la pandemia de COVID-19. Además, las palabras que se suelen utilizar para acompañar la imposición de cenizas individuales; "Recuerda que eres polvo, y al polvo volverás" se declarará sólo una vez públicamente como parte de la oración general antes de que las personas procedan al frente para recibir las cenizas en silencio. Las cenizas se espolvorearán en las puertas al salir de la iglesia al final de la Misa. El Miércoles de Ceniza, aunque popular, no ha sido un día obligatorio de asistencia a la iglesia, así que especialmente este año use la prudencia y la precaución para decidir si venir a la iglesia o no.
