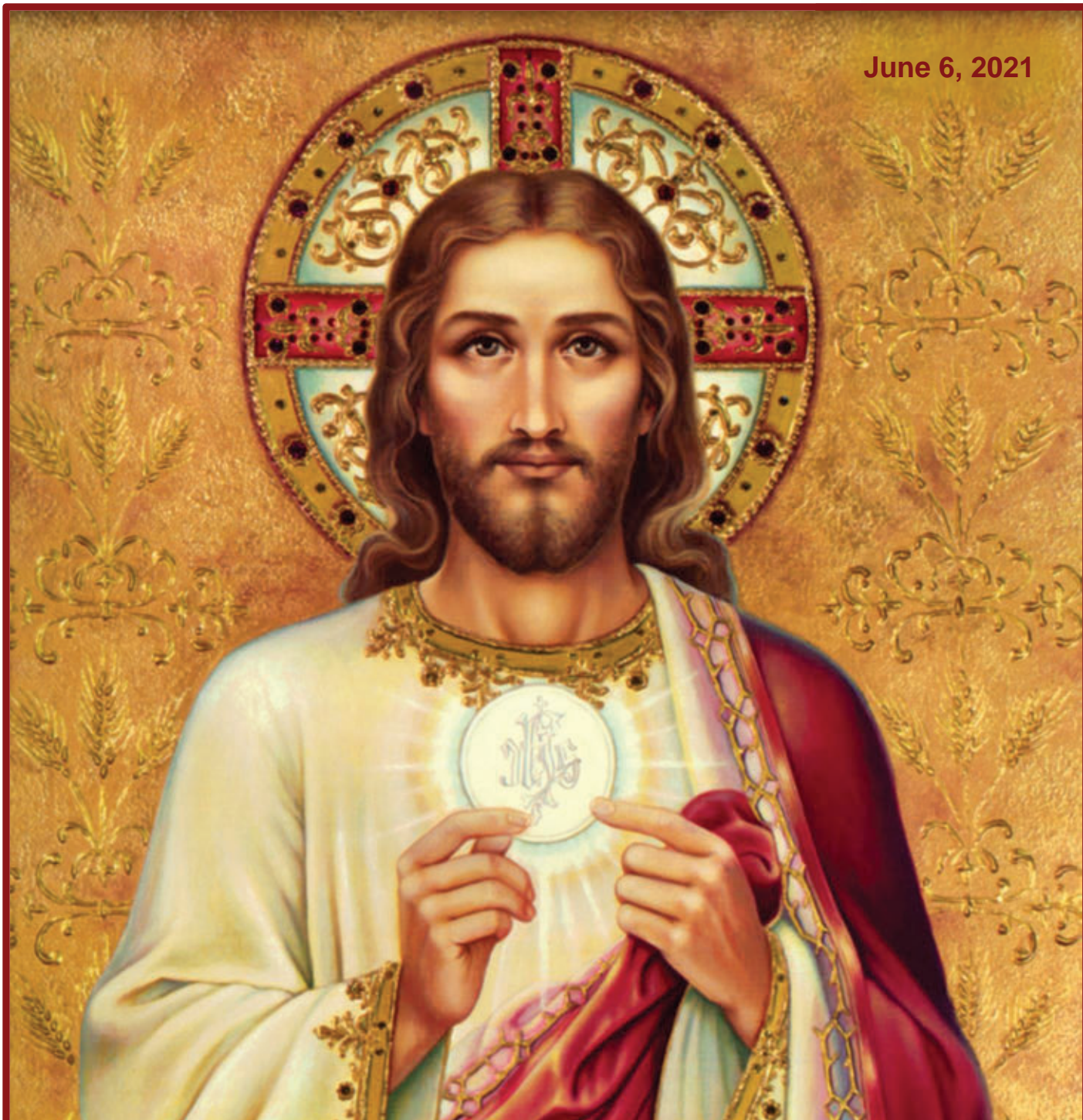

## PARISH PRIORITIES

### COVID-19, RENEWAL AND THE PARISH JUNE 1, 2021 UPDATE

#### Celebration of the Eucharist

The **Rite of Communion** has been restored to its pre-pandemic place in the daily and Sunday Masses at St. Joseph. To maintain hygiene, these points are to be followed:

- † For daily Masses and the smaller Sunday Masses, parishioners can approach for Communion via the center aisle and return to the pews via the side aisles.
- † For large Sunday Masses, we are in the process of determining of how many people will want to sit in the reserved, socially distanced section of the church (section closest to the tabernacle) before formalizing Communion distribution plans, or if additional special seating will be needed. Those who sit in the special section will receive Communion in a safe procession “loop” that will not involve close contact with others.
- † At the Final Blessing, the clergy will reverence the altar and exit via the side doors. The congregation will follow. The front door functions now only as the “entrance door” of the church; the congregation may not exit from those doors.
- † No lingering or congregating within the church, including the narthex, at any time is permitted.
- † The offering of the Precious Blood and the use of holy water fonts are still prohibited, as per diocesan guidance.

#### Masks

As of May 28, as per CDC guidelines and those of the Diocese of Metuchen, for the faithful participating in Mass, **masks are no longer required. A section will remain with social distancing practices for those who feel safer with more space.**

We still encourage, but are not mandating, general mask use among the congregation.

We strongly encourage all to get vaccinated.

We will maintain open windows and doors in church, as weather permits, and the use of the overhead fans.

#### Liturgical Schedule

With more available pews and a bloated Sunday Mass schedule to accommodate distancing, the next step in our parish revitalizing process will be the reduction of one Mass in our English Mass schedule, and an adjustment in making one currently Spanish Mass bilingual.

In recognition of the small size of the parish, we expect again to have one full-time priest, with available “supply priest” help on weekdays/Sundays. These steps will hopefully be taken together, in June or July.

#### Liturgical Ministries

As for the reinstatement of **liturgical ministries**, our activation plan has no connection now to COVID-19, but rather the implementation of a comprehensive pastoral plan that will stretch over the coming months. Former or aspiring liturgical ministers will be asked to join an application process, formation and training. ***All former ministers must re-apply if they desire to have post-pandemic service.*** This will take place over the summer months, should the pandemic numbers continue to lend themselves to safer environments. More information will be available over the summer. We are creating a new concept of what liturgical service means at St. Joseph Parish, with new requirements, responsibilities and opportunities.

The future form of sacred music liturgical ministry will follow a related path, in consultation with the parish music director.

#### Family Faith Formation

The year of Religious Education instruction has concluded. We plan to launch a new family-centered Faith Formation model in 2022, and it will be a continuous model, no longer connected to the school year.

Introduced on the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker May 1, we had brisk sales of parish logo T-shirts (long and short sleeve, \$25 and \$20 respectively) and baseball caps (\$20). Thanks to all who purchased items. We will keep a running stock of the items to serve parishioner interest. You can pay either by cash at the parish entrance, or bring up the parish website on your phone and make a one-time purchase with your credit card via the PayPal button.

#### FINAL NOTE

The goal of the revitalizing process is a comprehensive “St. Joseph Way” in what we do and how we do it, inspired by a contemplative spirit, a desire to foster parish-wide unity, and to have a special heart for the poor and marginalized.

## **ACTUALIZACIÓN DEL COVID -19 EN LA PARROQUIA AL 1 DE JUNIO DEL 2021**

### **Celebración de la Eucaristía**

El Rito de Comunión ha sido restaurado a su lugar antes de la pandemia en las misas diarias y dominicales en St. Joseph. Para mantener la higiene, se deben seguir estos puntos:

- † Para las misas diarias y las misas dominicales más pequeñas, los feligreses pueden acercarse para la Comunión por el pasillo central y regresar a las bancas por los pasillos laterales.  
Para grandes misas dominicales, los feligreses sentados en el pasillo central pueden acercarse para la Comunión y regresar por el pasillo lateral izquierdo. Los sentados en el área de distanciamiento (cerca al Tabernáculo) lo pueden hacer del lado derecho y regresar por el pasillo lateral derecho.
- † En la Bendición Final, el clero reverenciará el altar y saldrá por las puertas laterales. La congregación saldrá por las puertas laterales. La puerta de entrada ahora se denominará la "puerta de entrada" de la iglesia; la congregación no puede salir por esas puertas.
- † No está permitido quedarse o congregarse dentro de la iglesia en ningún momento.
- † La Preciosa Sangre y el uso de la pila de agua bendita siguen estando prohibidos, según las orientaciones diocesanas.

### **Mascaras**

A partir del 28 de mayo, de acuerdo con las pautas de los CDC y las de la Diócesis de Metuchen, para los fieles que participan en la Misa, las máscaras ya no son necesarias. Se mantendrá un apartado con prácticas de distanciamiento social para quienes se sientan más seguros con más espacio.

Seguimos alentando, pero no exigiendo, el uso general de máscaras entre la congregación.

Recomendamos encarecidamente a todos que se vacunen.

Mantendremos las puertas y ventanas abiertas en la iglesia, según lo permita el clima, y el uso de ventiladores de techo.

### **Horario Litúrgico**

Con más bancos disponibles y un horario de misa dominical abultado para acomodar el distanciamiento, el siguiente paso en el proceso de revitalización de nuestra parroquia será la reducción de nuestro horario y un ajuste para hacer que una misa sea "bilingüe". Asimismo, esperamos la reducción en el tamaño de nuestro equipo de clérigos pastorales. Es de esperar que estos pasos se tomen juntos en junio.

### **Ministerios Litúrgicos**

En cuanto al restablecimiento de los ministerios litúrgicos, nuestro plan de activación no tiene conexión ahora con COVID-19, sino más bien la implementación de un plan pastoral integral que se extenderá durante los próximos meses. Se pedirá a los ministros litúrgicos anteriores o aspirantes que se unan a un proceso de solicitud, formación y capacitación. **Todos los exministros deben volver a presentar una solicitud si desean tener un servicio post-pandémico.** Esto se llevará a cabo durante los meses de verano, en caso de que el número de pandemias continúe prestándose a entornos más seguros. Habrá más información disponible durante el verano. Estamos creando un nuevo concepto de lo que significa el servicio litúrgico en la parroquia St. Joseph, con nuevos requisitos, responsabilidades y oportunidades.

La forma futura del ministerio litúrgico de música sacra seguirá un camino relacionado, en consulta con el director de música de la parroquia.

### **Formación Familiar en la Fe**

El año de instrucción en Educación Religiosa ha concluido. Planeamos lanzar un nuevo modelo de formación en la fe centrado en la familia en 2022.

### **Centro Parroquial y Otra Actividad Anterior**

El centro parroquial permanece cerrado mientras se evalúa el uso general de las instalaciones parroquiales. El objetivo del proceso de revitalización es un "St. Joseph Way" en lo que hacemos y cómo lo hacemos, inspirados por un espíritu contemplativo, un deseo de fomentar la unidad de toda la parroquia y tener un corazón especial por los pobres y marginados.
