### YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH CONTINUES

As the year of St. Joseph continues at the parish, we have these additions:

- 1) Continuing until next May, at the end of the Universal Prayer at each Sunday Mass for the duration of the year, we will pray the prayer to St. Joseph that concludes Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde*. Cards are now available. ***Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.***
- 2) When there is no liturgical event taking precedence, we will pray the Votive Mass for St. Joseph on Fridays for the rest of the Year of St. Joseph.
- 3) Our Contemplative theme for November is "Emptying" and our Action theme is "Accompaniment."
- 4) **NEW: Starting December 29, we will begin a weekly process of Consecration to St. Joseph, being developed by our parish Pastoral Council. More details shortly.**

### ST. JOSEPH IS A TOP TEN PARISH (BUT WE KNEW THAT ALREADY!)

Final 2021 Bishop's Annual Appeal statistics from the Diocese of Metuchen are in, and they show **St. Joseph Catholic Community placing 9th** in the diocese for the highest percentage over the parish goal. Thanks to your tremendous generosity, we raised **\$39,881, which was 121% over our goal** of \$33,000. Our percentage-over-goal was also the highest for all Somerset County parishes. Because of our success, \$3,440 in rebate money has been returned to the parish. Congratulations to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, Three Bridges, which topped the charts by being 156% over goal, and to Our Lady of the Mount Parish in Warren, which raised the most money overall, \$392,033.

### CPR/AED TRAINING SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 13

This 2½ hour class teaches Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and relief of Foreign Body Airway Obstruction (FBAO) for adult and child victims. Upon successful completion of this course, you will receive an American Safety and Health Institute (ASHI) certification card valid for two years. Class will be instructed by Dave Cozza, a certified CPR instructor. This training is being offered at no charge to St. Joseph parishioners. A collection will be taken up and all donations will go to the church. Training is for individuals ages 15 and up. Space is limited and registration is required. Registration will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Class sizes will be limited to comply with COVID-19 restrictions.
