YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH CONTINUES


As the year of St. Joseph continues at the parish, we have these additions:

eventually move to the Methodist Church on Union
Avenue, once flooding-associated repairs are
completed. During the interim period, the pantry will
be held in the PFC gym every Sunday from 1:00 PM 2:30 PM. You can help by volunteering to work at the
