### YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH CONTINUES...

#### BEGINNING THE CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH FOR INTERESTED PARISHIONERS

**Starting after the 7 PM Mass Dec. 29, we will begin a bi-weekly process of Consecration to St. Joseph, developed by our parish Pastoral Council, and concluding around the time our St. Joseph Year ends on May 1.** This process is based on the book Donald H. Calloway, MIC, *Consecration to St Joseph*, and includes:

- 33 themes in total, from December 29, 2021 to May 1, 2022.
- Every Wednesday at 7 PM Mass and Sunday at 6 PM Mass, preparation for consecration will take place as part of the bilingual Mass.
- People who want to do the consecration will be invited to attend the Mass every Wednesday at 7 PM and Sunday at 6 PM.

### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

**RCIA** Today's Gospel is a story of Mary and Joseph losing the twelve-year-old Jesus. When they finally find him, Mary chides Jesus, but he responds with his question... "Why did you look for me?" Is this a tale of adolescent rebellion and family tension? These are Jesus' first words in the Gospel of Luke. He poses them not only to Mary and Joseph, but to all people, at all times. We too must ask and answer the question: Why do we seek Him? Do we wish to seek Him, all by ourselves, or do we need to be connected to others who seek Him also? If you or someone you know is attempting to answer that question, "why are you searching for me," and wish to join other "seekers" in the Catholic Faith family, we invite you to an RCIA inquiry session. Inquiry sessions do not assume a commitment to join the Catholic Faith family. Inquiry sessions are opportunities to ask questions about God, Jesus, and the Catholic Faith family. All who are unbaptized, baptized into another faith denomination, or baptized catholic but have not received Eucharist or confirmation, are invited. Inquiry sessions are for those who wish to inquire, explore, and search for ways to grow in relationship with God.
